# **Governance and Sustainability**

2020 is a challenging year globally with the COVID-19 pandemic and several major climate disasters that had an unprecedented and devastating impact on businesses and livelihoods. Despite the seemingly insurmountable challenges and difficulties, governing bodies, institutions, and companies responded to the best of their capabilities. While there are no perfect solutions, the efforts and spirit are worth celebrating.

The research team at CGIO was also determined to carry on its research in corporate governance and corporate sustainability despite the challenges. We broke new grounds with new research projects on corporate governance and corporate sustainability. In addition to new research projects, we also generated academic journals that enriched the industry research CGIO undertakes.

2020 continues to be another fruitful year for CGIO as it strengthened its industry engagements with institutions and organisations such as the CPA Australia, Monetary Authority of Singapore, Securities Investors Association (Singapore) (SIAS), Singapore Exchange, Singapore Institute of Directors, WWF, to name a few. In addition to these valued connections, CGIO also embarked on new partnerships with Carbon Care Asia, Global Reporting Initiative, Institute of Directors (India), Ministry of Culture, Community and Youth, China Construction (South Pacific) Development Co Pte Ltd, and Chinese Enterprises Association (Singapore). We were able to plan for executive development programme, run research reports, seminars and forums to uplift the corporate governance and corporate sustainability scene in Singapore and the region.
