



Dr Wei-Guo Zhang is currently the PricewaterhouseCoopers Professor in Accounting in Shanghai University of Finance and Economics, Professor of Management Practice in Tsinghua University's School of Economics and Management, and supervisor of post doctoral researchers of China Securities Regulatory Commission.

Born in Shanghai in 1957, Professor Zhang started his university education in Shanghai University of Finance and Economics (SUFU) in 1978. He got his BA, MA and PhD from SUFE in 1982, 1985 and 1989. He became Associate Professor in SUFU in 1987, Professor in 1992, and PhD supervisor in 1993. He served as the Head of SUFE's Department of Accounting from 1992 to 1997. He also served as the PhD supervisor in Tsinghua University from 1999 to 2007.

From 1997 to 2007, Dr Zhang served as the Chief Accountant and International Director of the China Securities Regulatory Commission (CSRC), China's capital market regulator.

From 2007 to 2017, Dr Zhang served as the Board Member of the International Accounting Standard Board (IASB) based in London, the first one from China, and the second one from Asia. During this period, he served as the member of CSRC's International Advisory Council.

Because of his outstanding performance, Dr Zhang has been granted various awards and honours, including National Outstanding Young University Teacher Award in 1989, National Outstanding Teacher Award in 1995. In 2005, he became the first person in CSRC to get Special Government Award from State Council, China's highest government administrative body.
