## ACSEP Training Programme: Social Impact Measurement

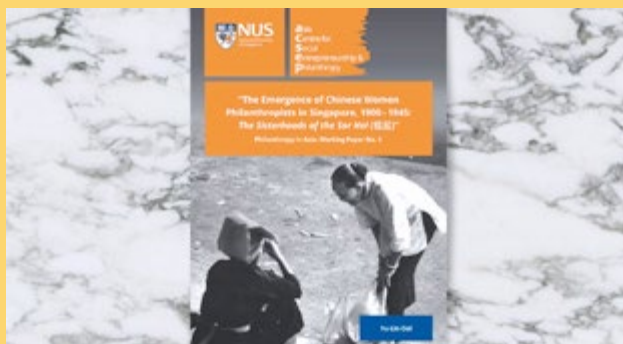

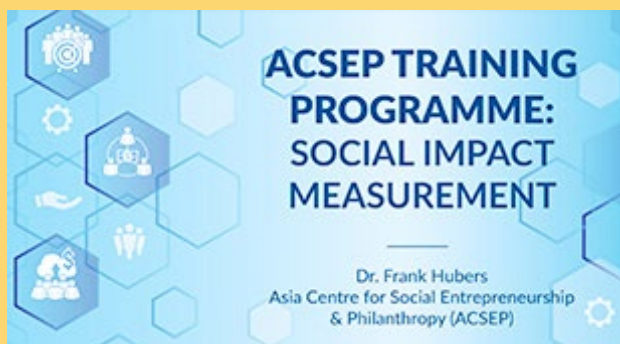
